Why a film market?

The Torino Short Film Market has come at a time of change in the history of the short film in our nation. After the success of the 1990s and the early years of the 21st century, the short format suffered a setback, in Italy more than in other parts of Europe, due to a diminished interest of cultural and economic operators. The fragmentation of the Italian festivals universe – at the last count there were more than 200 short film festivals – the contraction of investments on the part of major buyers, amongst which primarily television and the absence of a significant support policy have determined, over the last ten years, the marginal role of Italian short film production in Europe and worldwide. The need to meet for those who produce, distribute and purchase shorts, over and above festival venues, has been in the air for quite some time.

All you need do is go to the Marché du Film Court at Clermont-Ferrand set

up by the most important festival of short films in the world, to get some idea of how much the new generations of filmmakers and more in general, audiovisual operators are at home in places like film markets. You find such places in the major European nations, but not here in Italy. And this would already be enough to justify the commitment of the Italian Short Film Center to create the Italian Short Film Market. But the TSFM does not aim to be an Italian event just for Italians, on the contrary, our objective is to go international; it couldn't be any different in 2016!

When we speak of the “shorts market”, we are essentially talking about two things: the current “economic” times and the moment of “discovery”. The former is articulated around buying and selling products, meetings aimed at co-production, and developing productions; while the latter, means the proposal of unknown works and above all of untapped talent which has still to be discovered. If a short films market manages to meet these two targets, it has reached its goal. At the TSFM events will bring together distributors and buyers, proposals for production support, through European regional funding and the relative support policies will be illustrated; and finally, an event which amounts to a launch pad for feature length productions and TV series stemming from a short: Oltrecorto.

The 2016 TSFM is the zero edition. While I'm writing now, I have no idea as to how many guests will be accredited nor whether the market set up will work as planned. We are moving in an indefinable open space. It is a privilege – and at the same time a risk – of doing things for the first time. What's certain, though, is that Torino Short Film Market is opening up a construction site which – fortunately – will never be closed.

The video library

If the Torino Short Film Market was born to fill a gap in the production base and the Italian festival circuit connected to the short film – the complete absence of a place in which the film item can also be defined as goods – the video library too, aims to become a service offered to filmmakers, distributors and buyers different from those which already exist in today's festival galaxy, in Italy but not only.

When we started to design the video library we thought over what was missing in this service, which is commonly used by professionals like ourselves, each time, according to an annual cycle, we visit events we deem important for our job. So we stopped to consider what we actually felt was lacking, not as organizers but as users.

We think the major benefit of these systems is also the major weakness: the large number of films available brings with a vast selection also a sense of loss which doesn't help you find what you need, despite the quality of the research system of the video library interface. In our case we think the motto, by designer Dieter Rams "Weniger, aber besser" ("Less, but better") captures in a nutshell what we wanted to accomplish.

The video library of the Torino Short Film Market offers some hundreds of short films, selected personally during the course of the year by the curators with this event in mind. Our selection was geared towards products which could best meet the expectations of the market operators who have been invited and are present here.

The video library, in addition to being an in-house research engine through which users can carry out personalized research, provides various theme programs compiled by art directors, which last – about one hour and a half – like a quality short films festival but also seeking out products which suit other platforms and media. Lastly, our video library hosts and promotes the most up-to-date catalogues of various European and international distributors.

Original contents are now at the core of the ecosystem of the international audio visual which is starved for innovative and surprising talent and stories.

The idea at the basis of this project is that the very versatility of the short film – which is a short story, the chance of a new narrative, in addition to a tangible expression of talent all in one – represents a virtuous opportunity for the creative world of young people to meet that of the scripted industry.

More and more feature films or TV series concepts derive from short works, and more and more young talent is being found thanks to shorts which in turn is engaged in professional cinema or television projects. Much more than a teaser, a short film, despite its brevity can convey the directing and script qualities to the viewer.

Oltrecorto is a pitch and a tutorial, which wants to be a part of this new trend leading a short film to become a feature, a TV series, a concept that can be adapted to new narrative forms.

The way it works is simple: a selection of shorts is presented together with the project to develop them into a feature or TV series. This pitch is for international professionals of the scripted cinema-TV world

(producers, distributors, scenographers), with whom the participants at the pitch can meet on a one-to-one basis after the presentation.

The end for the participants is to create production projects even through the feedback and suggestions for development coming from professionals in the business. While on the other side, professionals will have the opportunity to meet new talent which they can “follow” and engage in possible new projects. Oltrecorto would like to become a talent-scout observatory for not yet fully fledged filmmakers and an opportunity to maintain close contact with the international production world.

Vlakna (Hairs)

Hairs is a TV series that follows Detective Veli on her day-to-day job as she resolves difficult criminal cases, while trying to come to terms with the burden left by her only open case: the murder of a suspected pedophile. The traces and evidence from this case mysteriously appear in every case she's working on.



Eleonora Veninova

She is a writer/director of award-winning short films and writer of several scripts for feature films. She is also one of the creators of the Macedonian TV series *Prespav* and is currently working on developing a thriller/mystery series based on her short film *Hairs*.



The short format is less suited to leave its country borders in the production phase than other audiovisual forms. International co-productions of shorts are rare also because of the lack of a specific policy of European funding. Generally speaking, with the remarkable exception of France, finding funding to produce shorts is difficult. For this very reason, the Torino Short Film Market has dedicated one of the events to certain European regional and national funds specially aimed at short films or which are among the formats to be supported.

The different types of funding and the specifics they represent will be found in the panel “Supporting Short Films”, thus opening up an ideally international showcase to producers who will come to the Torino Short Film Market.

Direzione Generale per il Cinema – MiBACT (IT)

DGC supports film industry through direct aids (grant) and indirect aids (fiscal). MAIA is a training and coaching programme specifically designed for emerging international producers. It aims at giving them the tools and instruments to improve and widen their daily working praxis. As a result they will be able to assert their ground as producers, master their work load, speed up their process of decision making, team up with the right partners and wire themselves to the changing audiovisual market as active players while affirming their own full potentialities.

The programme is closely concerned with the professional development of each individual participant. The three workshops are an intense learning and exchange process where the producers are active protagonists sitting at the same table with the international professional trainers and tutors. Plenary sessions, group work, case studies and opportunities for individual consultancies are articulated in such a way that participants bring their own contribution while taking advantage of the experience of peers and experts.

The producers' participation to the programme begins with the application, goes on between workshops and does not end after its completion: the alumni enter the MAIA community of participants and tutors and will be entitled to benefit of its meetings at major International Film Festivals, Master training and dedicated activities.

A new partnership with the Torino Short Film Market has been established in order to encourage the network between MAIA alumni and the professionals already confirmed.

A delegation of 6 MAIA producers, chosen for their interest and active work at international level in the shorts AV industry, will be in Turin and will actively take part to the market. They will have the possibility to develop their projects through meeting with professionals, panels and networking activities.




